Teams are made up of 10 – 15 members, each raising as much as they can prior to the event. Members aim for a minimum of \$100 each or a combined team effort of \$1500 or more. We have plenty of fundraising ideas to get you going - such as run a "100 club" or the team can join forces and to have a fundraising night of some type, its that easy!

With 1 in 2 Australians are diagnosed with cancer before the age of 85 so you may like to walk in honour of or even in memory of those touched by cancer.
